



## Context

In 2019 the Arts Council published its <u>Equality</u>, <u>Human Rights and Diversity Policy</u>, which included a three-year action plan (2019 – 2021). In the **Artists' actions** we have committed to collecting more information about the artists that apply for funding and those that receive funding. We have new systems in place to collect information about gender, ethnicity and disability and we plan to publish our first report on that during the summer.


We also committed to publishing an annual report on gender statistics on our website, from 2020 on. Here, we are providing the first of these, which details all those who applied for and received funding across our Individual Awards (incl. Bursaries, Travel & Training, Open Call, Next Generation, Project awards, Residency awards, and specialist schemes)<sup>1</sup> offered in 2019.


## **Arts Council individual awards 2019**

- In 2019 there were 1,674 applicants to the Arts Council for individual awards, requesting a total of €25,082,900
- ❖ Of this 491 (29%) received awards, to a total value of €5,581,464
- ◆ 1,011 female applicants requested a total of €13,830,384
- **❖ 307** (30%) female artists received awards to a total value of **€2,988,064**
- **♦ 636** male applicants, requested a total €11,252,517
- **◆ 184** (29%) male artists received awards to a total value of **€2,593,400**


- ❖ 61% of all applicants were **female** : 39% were **male**
- ❖ 63% of all recipients were **female** : 37% were **male** (Fig1)
- Overall male artists tended to seek and receive more money (Fig 2). However, this trend varied between art forms.




A percentage gender breakdown of recipients by art form / practice area is offered here\*:
