Professional artists or arts organisations that wish to collaborate **artistically** with non-arts professionals (individuals or groups)





Arts Council funding & advice

Awards are open to professional artists <u>and or</u> arts organisations to apply. *Please read the guidelines as this differs for each award.

To be eligible to apply applicants must be resident in the Republic of Ireland.



Opportunities in Arts Participation

Agility Award

The Agility Award is an Arts Council funding scheme for individual professional <u>artists and arts practitioners</u>.

You can apply for the Agility Award if you want to:

- Develop your practice
- Develop your work
- Develop your skills

Applicants can apply for an amount of €1,500 up to €5,000

Closing date: 25 April 2024

Arts Participation Bursary Award

The objective of the Arts Participation Bursary Award is to support <u>individual</u> <u>professional artists</u> working in any artform to **develop their practice** in the area of **participatory, collaborative and community arts.**

- Applicants can apply for an amount of €5,000 up to a maximum of €20,000.
- Closing date: 15 February 2024

Arts Participation Project Award 2025

The Arts Participation Project Award supports initiatives in the field of arts participation. The purpose of the award is to support proposals from <u>professional</u> <u>artists or arts organisations</u> that wish to collaborate **artistically** with non-arts professionals (individuals or groups).

- The activity will take place within a specific period of time
- There must be an artistic outcome
- Applicants can apply for an amount up to €60,000

Closing date: 25th July 2024 Further information can be found in the <u>Guidelines.</u>



Arts Grant Funding 2025

The purpose of Arts Grants Funding is to ensure that there is a breadth of high quality arts activity and programmes throughout the country by offering flexible support that responds to the needs of those who are making, presenting and supporting work. Arts Grant Funding is intended to:

- Support more than one distinct arts activity taking place within a fixed period of time, or
- Provide supports or facilities to artists over a fixed period of time.

There is no limit to the amount that can be requested, however we do work to budget constraints.

Closing date: 14 March 2024

Applying for funding Guidelines

All our awards have their own set of Guidelines and are available 2 weeks before the window of application opens, normally 6-8 weeks before the deadline.

Applying for Funding

Application Forms

Application forms are available to download from your Online Services Account.

- Once downloaded, save the form in a file where you can easily find it!
- When filling in your form, be sure to type into the grey box and click **Save** regularly.
- When completed, save as FINAL.



All of the awards have a number of mandatory documents that need to be submitted in addition to your application form for example, CV's, examples of work, letters of support etc.

Please read the guidelines to ensure you have all the correct documents prepared and ready to upload with your application form.

There are also optional documents that you can submit too.

How to apply

From your Online Services Account you can

- Update your personal details and other relevant information.
- Download the Application Form
- Upload your completed application form
- Upload your supporting materials
- Submit your application
- Request payments, should your proposal be successful



Double check everything you need is uploaded before clicking submit!



Eligibility

Applications are checked for eligibility to ensure all <u>mandatory</u> documents are submitted and the proposal meets the criteria of the award.

Your application will be deemed ineligible if you:

- Miss the deadline
- Do not upload mandatory supporting material
- Submit an incomplete Application Form
- If you apply for an incorrect award purpose
- Submit an application that has already assessed in a previous round of funding





Applicants with disabilities or access requirements who wish to submit an application or who have difficulties in accessing Online Services please contact the Arts Council's Access Officer, **as early as possible before the deadline**
